To all LPA members and lake residents,

Spring is here and the lake looks beautiful. I see many people already enjoying the recreational opportunities the lake provides. I believe we will have a lovely summer and lots to do on the lake.

On behalf of the Board, we want to thank all of the members who came to the business meeting on March 9. We were able to complete our **petition seeking to prohibit short-term rentals** in our Lake Pinehurst neighborhood. We have 160 property responses to date with 92% signing the petition supporting the prohibition of short-term rentals and 8% signing the petition in favor of continuing short-term rentals. We will be presenting the petition to the Village in early April. The Village will hold public meetings to discuss our petition and there will be many different views expressed. We hope the will of the people in our Lake Pinehurst neighborhood prevails.

With respect to **FEMA and our flood plain issues**, congress has submitted a bill for the president to sign that returns flood insurance rates to pre-2012 levels when they were raised significantly. We hope this reduces the cost to us, but we are waiting to hear from our residents to see what impact this bill will have on our properties. This bill does not remove your property from the flood plain.

The weed management program continues to be a "life and death" issue for our lake. If we fail to aggressively control the Hydrilla in our lake, the lake will become choked with these weeds and all recreational aspects of the lake will cease. Our property values will decline significantly. We need full participation of all lakefront properties, the five condo complexes and the Pinehurst Resort. Our cost-effective program is working and we have Hydrilla under control. We have asked that everyone participate since all of us benefit from this program. We must spray the entire perimeter of the lake throughout the year and add Hydrilla-eating carp to manage the deeper areas of the lake. Last year some individual properties chose not to participate. When someone chooses not to participate, it places increased financial burden on the rest of us to ensure that we protect and preserve the health and beauty of Lake Pinehurst and maintain our property values. It is my belief that those who choose not to participate disrespect their neighbors who must bear the additional cost and they also seem to have little concern for the value of their property. If there were a way to make this program mandatory, we would. It is a critical issue for everyone. There are two other concerns we want to raise.

First, **Canada geese** present a health hazard to the lake and surrounding properties. Three years ago we had more than 150 geese on the lake. These geese blessed our lake and surrounding properties with about 750 pounds of geese poop each and every day. If we let nature take its course, geese will overrun our lake and make recreational opportunities difficult if not possible. We have asked all lakefront properties to actively discourage the geese so they will go elsewhere. Please do not feed them. They will become dependent on humans for food, their population will increase, and, ultimately, they will have to be removed from the lake for human health reasons.

Second, over the last few years our lake has continued to fill up with **sand**, **silt**, **and dirt**. Some of this has been caused by the water flowing into the lake from streams, lakefront runoff, and the storm sewers that drain directly into the lake. However, some of this fill has come

directly from us. A few properties around the lake have built sandy beaches. Others have expanded their size by pushing their bulkheads farther into the lake and backfilling with dirt. Others have just dumped dirt into the lake without a retaining bulkhead. These actions cause erosion and could be detrimental to the lake. In North Carolina the water in the lake, and all living creatures in the lake, belong to the state. Dumping any fill matter into a lake may violate the regulations of the NC Department of Environment and Natural Resources (NC DENR). We encourage everyone to get permission from the state before placing any fill material in the lake.

Thank you to all our members and other lake residents who support the activities that focus on protecting and preserving the health and beauty of Lake Pinehurst. As always, we welcome your suggestions. You can email me directly at wreedy1@nc.rr.com.

Aquatic Weeds

We will be working with the same contractor, North Carolina Lake Management, again this year to treat the lake. The reports from the last quarter are very good and Tom Riel, our aquatic biologist that performs the actual treatments, will use the same schedule going forward for 2014. Of course in the winter months we do not see any weed growth and the cold weather actually helps keep the growth at bay. The water has to be over 65 degrees for treatment and we expect to have a treatment soon. We will have the lake treated at least twice a month starting in April through October for algae, aquatic weeds and shoreline grasses. We will have a submerged weed treatment, which requires water restriction for 10 days, 2 times a year depending on need. This treatment is essential to prevent the hydrilla from growing and spreading. We will be sending out email alerts in plenty of time so you can turn off your sprinkler systems. The 2400 carp that were added over the last 4 years has also helped with the hydrilla problem that we encountered 5 years ago.

Lawn Care

As we go into the growing season, I would like to encourage everyone to alert their lawn care companies to please blow the cut lawn grass back towards the house instead of into the lake. This will help keep the shoreline grasses down and especially now, during the spring, it's important not to blow towards the lake since there will be a lot of grass seed put down on our lawns as well.

Beavers

There have been some beaver sightings in the last month and they will cause major landscaping damage. We will always have beavers coming to our lake and to protect your landscaping put wire around the base of your shrubs, trees, rose bushes, etc at least 3 feet high. You can buy the wire, similar to chicken wire, at Lowe's Hardware. Please report any beaver activity to either Thom Mann or to me. If you see the beavers, call Thom, if you see damage email both us.

Lake Quality

We have seen vast improvement in the quality of the lake over the last 5 years thanks to your individual participation. Please continue to support the weed control program which is a great value for only \$50 per year! We need 100% participation. It is so important to maintain a healthy lake with controlled weeds through our spraying program and the carp, not only for our enjoyment of various lake activities but also for our property values.

Hope you have a great spring on our beautiful, healthy lake!!!

February NAC Meeting

Chief Earl Phipps was our speaker at the February NAC meeting. He presented a community safety overview. We are fortunate that he came to the LPA Annual meeting and provided an even more detailed report than I received at the NAC meeting. His new high tech equipment was quite impressive.

A few other notes from Chief Phipps and our Village of Pinehurst Police Department:

- A message to our citizens--Keep your eyes on your neighborhood and CALL THE PO-LICE DEPARTMENT if anything is out of the ordinary or looks suspicious. Even if you think it may not be anything...there may be a crime being committed.
- Our area is having quite a spike in phone, email, and mail scams. If you are receiving phone calls from unknown numbers, the Police Department suggests you do not answer. Many of these numbers are actually coming in from China and other countries. PLEASE DO NOT GIVE OUT ANY PERSONAL INFORMATION ESPECIALLY YOUR CREDIT CARD NUMBER OR SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER. If you are continue to have problems or have any questions, Chief Phipps asked that you call the police department. They are willing to check out the situation to find out if it is legitimate or not. Most are scams and the retired population seems to be their main target. If you receive anything in the mail and want to report it, you can take the documents to the police department. If you want to report a scam, you can also go to the North Carolina Attorney General's website.
